Entry for the Young Originals Exhibition is open to all Western Australian public school students from Years 7-12. Students must be under the age of 18 as of 1 January, 2019.

WHAT?

Western Australian secondary schools may submit a maximum of ten artworks. A single artwork is limited to three pieces. All artworks must have been completed in 2019. Works from previous years will not be accepted.

2D WORKS

- · Format: JPG (please select high quality setting).
- · Flat artworks such as paintings and photographs only require one image. If students are concerned with losing fine detail they can upload a maximum of two images, one of the whole artwork and then a close up called a 'detail'.

3D OR MULTIMEDIA WORKS

For time based works, upload the entire video. If students wish to enter a sculptural work, provide photographs of a full rotation of the piece. Please keep the number of images to a maximum of four.

All entries will be judged by a panel of representatives from the arts education community. The panel's decision is final.

WHEN?

Uploaded to the website no later than 5:00pm

No late entries will be accepted.

CRITICAL DATES AND TIMES

- Tuesday 16 July 2019 Schools will be advised of selection outcomes.
- Tuesday 30 July 2019: 10:00am-5:00pm Selected works must be delivered to Gallery 25, (ML 10.121) at Edith Cowan University, Mount Lawley. Works must be framed or mounted to a good standard for exhibition. If an artwork comprises more than one element, instructions for its layout must be provided.
- Friday 9 August 2019 Opening night, by invitation only.
- Wednesday 28 August 2019: 10:00am-5.00pm Artworks must be collected. Schools are to arrange their own collection and couriers.

PACKING. DELIVERING AND HANGING REQUIREMENTS. STRICTLY ENFORCED THIS YEAR!

- · All painted artworks must be dry.
- Photographic work must be framed for hanging.
- Artworks should be packed in bubble wrap with bubbles facing outwards and fastened with masking tape.
- 2D and framed artworks must have D-rings attached for hanging. Two D-rings, one either side at the same distance top to bottom, ¾ of the way up. D-rings are to be placed at least 1.5cm from the outside of the frame.
- Where wire is used for hanging the artwork, it must be firmly attached at each side with D-rings.
- If an artwork is heavy, a trolley should be used for transport with the weight balanced appropriately.
